LENT

Laetare (Latin for rejoice) Sunday is the popular name for the fourth Sunday in Lent. Laetare Sunday has traditionally been viewed as a day of celebration, on which the austerity of Lent is briefly lessened. On Laetare Sunday, the purple vestments and altar cloths of Lent are set aside, and rose ones are used instead. Traditionally, the organ was never played during Lent, except on Laetare Sunday. The point of this Sunday is to provide us encouragement as we progress toward the end of the Lenten penitential season.
