PALM SUNDAY

On Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) the Church enters upon the mystery of our crucified, buried and risen Lord, who, by His entrance into Jerusalem, gives a glimpse of His own majesty. Christians carry branches as a sign of the royal triumph that Christ won by His acceptance of the cross. Since St. Paul says: "Provided we suffer with Him in order that we may also be glorified with Him", the link between these two aspects of the Paschal Mystery should stand out clearly in the liturgical celebration and the catechesis of Palm Sunday.
