## CATHEDRAL BASILICA CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES ON THE OUTSIDE

During the next few months of spring, summer, and early fall, you will notice work continuing on the outside of the Cathedral Basilica grounds as we finish the final landscape around the Cathedral. The work will include the installation of a heating system surrounding the Cathedral for the removal of ice and snow. This is needed to preserve the Cathedral's slate floor from the harsh effects of the salt currently being used. At various times, entrances will be closed to accommodate this work, although we will endeavour to have all three front doors open on the weekend. The historic fence and lighting features will be restored and we will add a new pedestrian gate in the centre which will allow us to close the vehicle gates and restrict their use to times when needed such as weddings and funerals. Our statue of Mary will be placed in a secure location and returned when the landscape work is complete.

The trees currently in front of the Cathedral will be removed because three of them are dead and the others are dying. They will be replaced at a later date when the complete Cathedral Block Plan is implemented. Thank you for your continued patience as we complete this final phase of our restoration.
