SAVE SUMMER JOBS & REACH OUT TO YOUR MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT

Is it fair that Canadians must agree with the government to be eligible to participate in a federal program? Groups applying for the 2018 Canada Summer Jobs grant were required to indicate their agreement with certain beliefs held by the current federal government. This contravenes the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, which guarantees the freedom of religion and conscience, of thought, belief, opinion and expression, as well as "equal protection and equal benefit of the law without discrimination."

Dozens of Catholic organizations throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto were impacted by this policy.
