Entrance Gospel: Matthew 21:1-11

#### **PALM SUNDAY**

Palm Sunday commemorates Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, as we begin the final week of Lent, also called **Holy Week**. We celebrate by the blessing and distribution of palm branches, which represent the palms people scattered in front of Our Lord as he rode into Jerusalem mounted on a donkey.

As we approach Easter, it is important to remember the Jewish heritage of the Church. Each year, our Jewish neighbours celebrate Passover, commemorating the Exodus from Egypt. Easter grew out of this feast, and Jesus and his disciples, as faithful Jews, were gathered in Jerusalem at this time to celebrate the great festival.

The Church teaches, "in her rejection of every persecution against any man, the Church, mindful of the patrimony she shares with the Jews and moved not by political reasons but by the Gospel's spiritual love, decries hatred, persecutions, displays of anti-Semitism, directed against Jews at any time and by anyone." (Nostra Aetate, Vatican Council II.)

#### **PASCHAL FAST**

To prepare ourselves for Easter, the paschal fast should be observed on Good Friday and continued, where possible, on Holy Saturday. Fasting helps us receive the joys of the Lord's resurrection at Easter with uplifted and responsive hearts. On fast days, people between 18-59 years old are asked to only have one full meal and two smaller meals. Eating meat is not permitted on fast days, but fish and other seafood may be eaten.

#### **CHRISM MASS**

This Mass is celebrated by the Archbishop and his college of priests. At this Mass, he consecrates the Holy Chrism and blesses the other oils. The priests also renew the promises that they made at their ordination to the Archbishop.

Please keep in mind that our **12:10 PM Mass** will be canceled this **Tuesday April 4**, as the Chrism Mass will take place at **11:00 AM**. People are welcome to attend, and this Mass will be livestreamed at: www.stmichaelscathedral.com/live/.

# **APRIL 2, 2023**

#### **TENEBRAE**

All are welcome to join us for Tenebrae on **Wednesday April 5 at 7:30 PM**. From the Latin word for "darkness," Tenebrae is a liturgy of evening prayer on Wednesday of Holy Week, which follows Jesus through the passion and death and foreshadows His triumphant resurrection. Candles are gradually extinguished until the Cathedral is dark. The beautiful antiphons, psalms and canticles will be sung by the students and alumni of **St. Michael's Choir School**.

#### **HOLY THURSDAY**

This night's celebration includes the washing of feet, and a Eucharistic procession. This is followed by the stripping of the altar and a period of personal adoration. All are invited to spend some quiet time in prayer with the Lord.

#### **GOOD FRIDAY**

This service takes us back to the earliest days of the Church and to the primitive manner of celebration. The practice of venerating the cross comes from Jerusalem and found its way into the Roman liturgy in the late seventh century. The ceremony of unveiling the cross dates from the twelfth century. After the service, everyone leaves in silence.

#### **EASTER VIGIL**

We begin the Vigil (or Night Watch) with the Service of Light. The Easter (Paschal) Candle is lit from the new fire, which is blessed. The Deacon or Priest sings the Easter proclamation. Seven Old Testament passages are read, each followed by a psalm and a prayer. The altar candles are lit, and the Gloria is sung as the Church expresses her Easter joy. The celebration continues with the Mass as usual. Catechumens are initiated into the Church, and we renew our Baptismal Promises. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is the final part, and the culminating point, of the Passover event.
